Grading Criteria

- **Classwork** **40%**
 - *Pay attention, take notes, get involved in the class activities, follow instructions, respect others' right to learn.*
- **Warm ups** **20%**
 - *Sit down as the bell rings and start doing your exercise. Wait silently when you finish.*
- **Tests** **25%**
 - *At the end of each unit, they are based on textbooks, handouts and notes.*
- **Homework** **15%**
 - *The teacher will say it at the end of the lesson; also, you may check it on gradespeed AND on Ms. P's website; save it on your digital portfolio or place it on your desk as you do your warm up the following day.*
